EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Rock of Ages Empowerment Foundation was founded in 2007 and registered as a corporate body on the 23rd June, 2009 under the Companies and Allied Matter Act, (Part 'C') 1990 of the federal Republic of Nigeria. We carry out free medical treatment; free education support programs, youth and widows empowerment.

The Rock of Ages Empowerment Foundation believes in restoring hope, giving hope to the widows and orphans and in so doing, the foundation uses her yearly international widow's day celebration to empower widows who were trained on different skills and also provide scholarship to the orphans.

The foundation carries out research, training, outreaches and public educational campaigns about the needs for widow's empowerment, orphans and other vulnerable groups in the society. It is committed to its mission of transforming the lives of the underprivileged individuals through quality education, good medical treatments, and financial support, regardless of age, gender, race, religion or financial status.

During the 2011 International Widows Day Celebration organized by Rock of Ages Empowerment Foundation, over 18 million naira was spent to empower widows in various service delivery areas, 1200 widows were empowered with 10kg bag of rice each, 100 widows received sewing machines, about 600 widows were given wrappers, while 100 were empowered with frying pan. However, 30 orphans received money for school fees.

The medical component of the event of the 2012 International widows day celebration started with a health talk on various topics e.g hand wash, ebola control, HIV prevention messages by a trained nurse, involved the check of blood pressure, Clients were tested for malaria parasite, typhoid fever, arthritis, blood glucose. There was free consultation and free drugs. There were free eye check, reading glasses and eye drops were given to various people with eye defect. Referrals were made to appropriate health facility if any. Out of 1080 widows that accessed free medical diagnosis and treatment, 65% have malaria and were treated, 4% have hypertension and were treated, 3% were treated for diabetes mellitus, 7% treated for arthritis, 8% widows were also treated for eye problem cases using eye drops, and reading glasses, 6% treated for typhoid fever, 4% were treated for worm. whereas 1% with skin infection were treated as well.




Figure 1, 2011 International Widows Day empowerment




Figure 2; 2011 International Widows Day Free medical treatment




Figure 3; 2011 International Widows Day Free medical treatment

From the figures 2 and 3 above, out of 1080 widows access free medical diagnosis and treatment, 65% have malaria and were treated, 4% have hypertension and were treated, 3% were treated for diabetes mellitus, 7% treated for arthritis, 8% widows were also treated for eye problem cases, 6% treated for typhoid fever, 4% were treated for worm. whereas 1% with skin infection were treated as well.
