Year 2019 was a significant one for Rock of Ages Empowerment Foundation (RAEF) as the foundation extended her hands of support and reached out to the less privileged in various grassroots communities with free medical outreach programs, empowerment programs to widows and women as well as payment of school fees for identified orphans in these communities.

The Rock of Ages Empowerment Foundation, (RAEF) as we all know is an indigenous Nigerian NGO registered with the Corporate Affairs Commission. It believes in restoring hope, giving hope to widows, orphans and the less privileged in the society.

The foundation carries out trainings, outreach programs and public educational campaigns about the needs for widow's empowerment, orphans and other vulnerable groups in the society. It is committed to its mission of transforming the lives of the underprivileged individuals through quality education, good medical treatments, and financial support, regardless of age, gender, race, religion or financial status. In the year ending, the foundation empowered over 3, 000 widows with livelihood information, food items and clothing materials both within and outside Abuja and gave financial empowerment in form of 'Start up Grant' to over 500 widows. Free medical outreach programs were also carried out in various communities within the FCT Abuja. Empowerment training were also conducted for youths in FCT and school fees were always paid for the less privilege children within and around Abuja.

The message here is not about what the

foundation has been doing for the less privilege but about what we need to do better. In continuing to do so, we seek support and partnership of like-minded individuals, organizations, philanthropists and donors agencies. A particular challenge to our work remains insufficient funds to implement programs targeted to support these widows and orphans yearly.

We cannot accomplish these ambitious goals alone. Rock of Ages Empowerment Foundation is a Nonprofit and charitable organization founded in 2007 and was registered as a corporate body on the 23rd June, 2009 under the Companies and Allied Matter Act, (Part 'C') 1990 of the federal Republic of Nigeria. It owes and carries out free medical treatment; free education support programs, youth and widows empowerment.

The Foundation believes in restoring hope, giving hope to the widows and orphans and in so doing, the foundation uses her yearly international widow's day celebration to empower widows who were trained on different skills and also provide scholarship to the orphans. It is committed to its mission of transforming the lives of the underprivileged individuals through quality education, good medical treatments, and financial support, regardless of age, gender, race, religion or ethnic group. The Foundation has its head office in Abuja and outreach stations in 7 other states in Nigeria. We deliver in the following areas (**THEMATIC AREA**)

A Education

Rock of ages empowerment foundation aim at reducing illiteracy in Nigerian rural communities, engage in education supports programs such as distribution of books, school uniform, bags, and laboratory equipment etc to primary and secondary schools. We advocate for the need for Girl-child education at least to secondary school level. We provide scholarships to children of the widows and the less privileged in the society.

B Health

We are focusing services on vulnerable groups such as women especially widows and children in the following areas; Routine free medical outreaches to complement the efforts of the primary healthcare services; HIV/ AIDS and other diseases awareness, prevention and care services; Health education to pregnant women (PMTCT) in the rural communities; Health advocacy and promotion program; Medical check-up for aged men and women and various training on Personal Hygiene and disease prevention

C Empowerment

We provide skill acquisitions training, capacity building and development for widows and youths, financial supports, financial management training as well as provision of foods, clothing and shelter.

D Agriculture

In the area of agriculture, we providing training to widows farmers in crop production, management and marketing; formation of farmers (widows) into Clusters; we provide capacity building in the areas of leadership, cooperation and record keeping, link the farmers to stakeholders forum and build capacity in the areas of gender and family budgeting

D Career Counseling

In career counseling, we are developing the self-awareness of the students/ clients; provide professional course information for higher school leavers; provide labour market information for graduates and help clients in making decision and setting goals assist them in planning for job search.

Pyakasa Community Free Medical Outreach

In the year 2019 RAEF took a decision to reach out to the less privilege in various communities as a way of achieving her mission and vision. This decision was reached not only to reach out to the less privilege with free medical treatment but also it is a medium to identify widows, women who need financial empowerment and children in need of support to go back to school.

In the month of May 11th, 2019, RAEF took to Pyakasa community to kick start her desire to reach out to the less privilege in communities. During the program a total of 674 number of individuals accessed various health indicators. Out of which 83 number of individuals were treated for malaria, 21 persons whose blood pressure measured over 140/90mmHg were treated, 7 persons whose blood sugar level above 200mg/dl were treated, 8 children were given Vitamin A, whereas 304 children were

given Vitamin B. 3 children received oral polio vaccines, 14 persons with symptoms of arthritis were treated, 167 persons were given reading glasses, 17 persons were de wormed, 27 persons, and 13 persons were treated for gastrointestinal tract, and respiratory tract infections respectively, 3 persons that showed symptoms of diarrheal were treated. 6 persons were treated for skin condition, whereas 1 individual with toothache also received treated.

The RAEF medical teams and volunteers were present at the program as well as the following; Vision Edge Eye & Optical Services LTD, members of the FCT Primary Healthcare Board were on ground to provide free immunization to children, free dental care, free malaria and BP check etc. The event was well attended and covered by the media.

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REPORT FROM THE 2019 INTERNATIONAL WIDOWS DAY CELEBRATION "BETTER DAYS AHEAD"

The 2019 International Widow's Day Celebration being the 9th edition in the history of Rock of Ages Empowerment Foundation (RAEF) was a success with the theme "BETTER DAYS AHEAD". The event took place on the 23rd June, 2019 at the Idris Abdulkadir Auditorium, National University Commission (NUC), 36 Aguiyi Ironsi Street, Maitama Abuja.


Present at the event were important dignitaries such as, the Secretary to the Federal Government (Represented), Hon. Justice Mary Odili, the Matron of RAEF (Represented), Dame Pauline Tallen, the former deputy Governor of Katsina State and the Chairman Board of Trustees National Agency for the Control of AIDs (NACA), the Executive Director NTA (Represented) and the Chairman of the occasion Dr. Oluseyi Babatunde Oyebisi, who is the Executive Director, Nigeria Network of NGOs (NNNGO) among other dignitaries, Representatives from the Primary Healthcare Board, FCT Abuja, RAEF Partners, CSOs, Supporters, Friends and well-wishers, over 1,500 Widows under the umbrella of the Foundation, different Media Representatives and the master of ceremony was Expensive of Wazobia FM.

The event was spiced with cultural dance; welcome songs and other cultural display by the widows. The RAEF Program Director Mrs. Rita Ndubuisi took the lead in this empowerment to ensure that all widows were impacted upon in one way or another.

During the event widows trained on various skills were given certificate of trainings while over 60 widows were financially supported with N30,000 each (N1.8million naira) as start up grants, and 3 outstanding zones were motivated with a trophy each, and supported with N30,000 naira.

Food items (bags of rice) were distributed to over 1500widows present at the occasion, and fabrics that worth (Millions of naira) were distributed to 800 widows. More so, 8 widows were empowered with grinding machines that worth (hundreds thousands of naira).

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
The Success story of widows empowered during the past years were not left behind. Several widows on this category came out with a practical evidence of how the empowerments changed their lives and the lives of their family. Other areas touched to impact upon the lives of the widows were the free medical outreach component which precede (between 8am – 3pm) the empowerment and ceremony proper, started with a health talk to sensitize the widows. During the free medical outreach, RAEF Medical teams and Volunteers were present to attend to the health of the widows.


Other medical specialist present during the free medical outreach were the Vision Edge Eye & Optical services LTD (Free eye care), HIV/AIDS HealthCare Foundation Clinic Abuja (Free HIV/AIDs Screening), Right to Live well Foundation (Free Hepatitis Screening and Vaccination) and free eye care were all on ground to provide free medical treatment, counseling and testing services to the populace.

The widows were tested for malaria parasite, blood glucose. There was free consultation and free drugs. The widows were de-wormed; they were tested for hepatitis, and vaccinated against hepatitis infection. There were free eye check; free reading glasses, free eye drops and drugs were given to widows with eye defect. There were free dental care services for widows. There were free HIV/AIDs screening and referrals were made to appropriate health facility. Total of 1057 widows accessed the services, out of which 155 clients were diagnosed with malaria parasite using RDT, and treated, 87 persons whose blood pressure measure over 140/90mmHg were treated, and 11 persons whose blood sugar level above 200mg/dl were treated. Out of 102 persons tested for hepatitis, 100 persons tested negative, and were vaccinated, however 2 persons result showed positive for hepatitis. 60 persons were diagnosed with typhoid fever and treated. 48 number of widows diagnosed with dental problems were treated, whereas out of 163 diagnosed with eye problems, 100 received reading glasses, while 53 were given eye drops, however, 10 other eye problems were referred out. 36 numbers of widows were diagnosed and treated for Peptic ulcer diseases, 4 persons were treated for Arthritis. 18 persons were diagnosed and treated for Urinary tract infection, whereas 15 persons with Respiratory tract infections were also treated. Out of 457 persons de-wormed, 450 were widows, while 7 were children.

The adults received 2 worm tablets each making it a total of 900 tablets dispensed, while 7 children that accompanied them received 1 tablet each making it a total of 7 tablets dispensed to children. However, 907 worm drugs were dispensed. 77 widows accepted to be tested for HIV, only 3 were reactive, and they were referred to HIV/AIDS Healthcare Foundation clinic Abuja for further evaluation and enrolment into care and treatment.


During the event, the RAEF medical teams, community volunteers, Vision Edge Eye & Optical services LTD, AIDS HealthCare Foundation Clinic Abuja, Right to Live Well Foundation, team from Primary Healthcare Board were on ground to provide free medical treatment, free eye care, free dental care, free hepatitis screening and counseling and HIV counseling and testing services to the populace. The event was well attended and covered by some media team like Wazobia FM.

The highlight of the event was to provide more access to the uptake of health care services to the general population in the remote and rural areas. A total of 860 individuals accessed various health indicators at the event. Out of which 225 were treated for malaria, 82 persons whose blood pressure measured over 140/90mmHg were treated, 7 persons whose blood sugar level above 200mg/dl were treated, out 88 individuals tested for hepatitis virus 13 tested hepatitis positive, whereas 75 individuals who tested positive were vaccinated.. 7 persons with signs and symptoms of diarrheal were treated, 111 persons with eye defect were given reading glasses 38 persons were de wormed, 14 persons that showed symptoms of ulcer were treated, 20 persons were treated for skin condition, 59 individuals received dental care, 36 individuals were treated for typhoid fever, 24 persons received treatment for cough, whereas 38 individuals with urinary tracts infection also received treated.

Furthermore, out of 107 numbers of individuals who accessed HIV counseling and testing, 80

female tested HIV negative, while 27 male tested HIV negative. However, no reactive cases were recorded.





REPORT ON YOUTH TRAINING

2019 YOUTH DAY TRAINING PROGRAM AND FREE MEDICAL OUTREACH

The 2019 Youth Day Training Program organized by RAEF on 31st October - 2nd November, 2019 at the RAEF Permanent Site in Pyakasa was a huge success. The program which lasted for 3days was aimed at training Youths on different skill acquisition trainings like production of liquid Soup, Vaseline, air freshener, disinfectant, production of school/laptop bag using Ankara material and production of paints. A free medical outreach & de worming program was carried out on the last day of the training to wrap up the 3days program.

The highlight of this Youth Day Training Program was the free medical outreach carried out. The RAEF medical teams were well represented and present also were volunteers, Vision Edge Eye & Optical services LTD, Right to Live Well Foundation, FCT Primary Healthcare Board, and EMZOR Company were on ground to provide free medical treatment, free eye care, free vaccine immunization and free deworming program.

The Trainings were group into the following:

Liquid Soap, Vaseline, Air freshener, and disinfectant production: This category of training had 373 youths as participants. They were taught how to make liquid soap, Vaseline, air freshener, and disinfectant. There were practical sessions at the end of the training. The participants were overwhelmed as they expressed their gratitude about the training and its simplicity.





School/Laptop Bag Production with Ankara Material: The school/laptop bag making with Ankara material attracted the same number of youths (373) as participants. They were assiduously taught how to make bag using Ankara material. There were practical sessions to that effect and a finished product was displayed.





Paints Production: This category attracted 388 numbers of youths as participants. All the participants were fully engaged in the operational procedures in paints production. At the end of the training the participants expressed their utmost satisfaction and gratitude to the management and staff of Rock of Ages Empowerment Foundation for this laudable program geared towards self empowerment, self reliance and financial independent.


Free Medical/De worming Program for Adults and Children: During the free medical outreach/de-worming program, there were free eye check, free dental check, free hepatitis test and vaccination, free de worming program by Emzor Company, general body check for



malaria, typhoid, hypertension, and diabetes as well as free immunization for children by some members of the FCT Primary Healthcare Board.

Total of 1739 individuals accessed the services, out of which 400 clients were diagnosed with malaria parasite using RDT, and treated, 40 persons whose blood pressure measure over 140/90mmHg were treated, and 1 person whose blood sugar level above 200mg/dl were treated. Out of 91 persons tested for hepatitis, 87 persons tested negative, and were vaccinated, however 4 persons result showed positive for hepatitis. 55 persons were diagnosed with typhoid fever and treated. 200 number of individuals received free dental care, out of 152 that received free eye care services, 6 persons were referred out for further examination. However, 76 received reading glasses, while 70 were given eye drops. 50 numbers of individuals were diagnosed and treated for Peptic ulcer diseases, 10 persons were treated for Arthritis. 7 persons were diagnosed and treated for Urinary tract infection, whereas 15 persons with vaginal discharge were also treated. Out of 500 persons (children) de-wormed, 297 were female, while 203 were male. 174 number (children) of individuals received free vaccine immunization. 40 persons were treated for waist pain, whereas 4 persons received treatment for skin rashes infection.

REPORT ON FREE MEDICAL OUTREACH IN ENUGU STATE

REPORT ON THE FREE MEDICAL OUTREACH DONE IN OFFOR OPI, NSUKKA, ENUGU STATE ON 28TH DECEMBER, 2019

Rock of Ages Empowerment Foundation (RAEF) extended free medical outreach program to the people of OPI community in Nsukka, Enugu State, Nigeria. The outreach took place in December 28, 2019 as part of RAEF commitment in giving good medical treatment to the general population.

One location was used for the outreach which was set up at Ofor OPI, OPI Nsukka, LGA Enugu State, Nigeria. A total of 1940 clients were examined and treated by the team of health professionals. Out of the 1940 clients that attended the free medical outreach program, 200 persons had blood pressure measure over 140/90mmHg, 150 persons had blood sugar level above 200mg/dl clients, 400 clients tested positive for malaria parasite using RDT, 500 persons with signs and symptoms of worm were de wormed, 250 persons were diagnosed with typhoid fever, 180 persons were diagnosed with ulcer, 30 persons were diagnosed with filariasis, and skin problem respectively, 15 persons were diagnosed with candidiasis and fungal infection respectively, 20 persons showed signs and symptoms of epilepsy, whereas 50 persons were diagnosed with body pain, eye problems and stress. All the individuals diagnosed with health problems received treatment.

Introduction

Access is still the greatest challenge to health care delivery in Nigeria. Fewer than 50% of Nigerian has access to modern health facilities. Many Nigerians spend less than 10% of their GDP on health care. Throughout the medical interventions in OPI Community, RAEF provided health care to the less privileged by partnering with medical doctors and health care givers. We also provided opportunities for free medical care, check-ups and treatments for the general population in the entire community. Our volunteers dispense free medicines to all participants - a lifeline for those who would otherwise be unable to afford them. Over 1900 individuals benefited from a free medical outreach program, and most of the beneficiaries were screened for blood sugar level, malaria, blood pressure, typhoid fever, eye defect etc, and were also given health talks. Children were also not left out as large numbers of them were de-wormed.

Objective of the Program

1. To improve access to quality health care in OPI, Nsukka Community in Enugu State, by providing direct medical care for the general population with the goal of linking them with a primary health centers.

- 2. Promote health literacy, healthier lifestyles, and general well being.
- 3. To give financial support and pay school fees for the less privileged in the community.

Participant and Area Covered

The outreach targeted the general population which includes aged men and women, youths (male and female gender), students, and children from the community. The list of Service Delivery Areas (SDA) covered during the free medical outreach in OPI community includes diagnosis and treatment of hypertension, diabetes, malaria, worm infection, typhoid fever, ulcer, filariasis, skin problems, candidiasis, fungal infection, epilepsy, stress, general body pain, and eye problems.

Methodology

The Free Medical Outreach Program consist of team of health professionals including registered nurses, Doctors, community health advocates and volunteers. The staff focuses on the health needs and services of the community. Emphasis is placed on health promotion, prevention, and developing links to community resources through health screenings, education and referrals.

Analysis









Key Findings
